

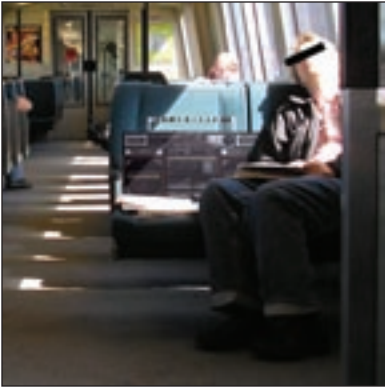

Picaresque The Decemberists (Kill Rock Stars)

How I love the Decemberists!
Acoustic, literate, chamber intelli-wacky pop. Think Hidden Cameras mixed with Neutral Milk Hotel.

The band's leader Colin Meloy writes Victorian themed songs, with imagery varied from the "cliffs of Dover," to a "barrow boy" to elephants and camels. Colin also writes great melodies, which sound great in the chamber instrumentation, from the acoustic guitars through the Hammond to accordion. Colin also manages to pull off a Victorianaesque affectation, and to use words like parapets, phalanx, folderol, and palanquin without sounding pretentious. Play the Decemberists or I'll push you up a chimney!

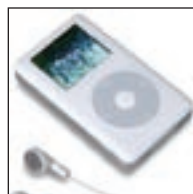
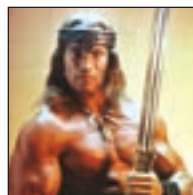

PRINCESS D: Oh dear I don't have any...

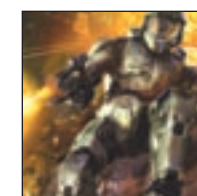
RAYMUNDO: Hosting my Friday night HALO 2 gaming night at my place. Man... thank god for my broadband connection, it brings out the geek in me.

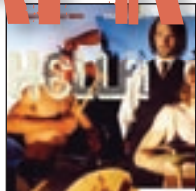
Listen to KZSU in an **EMERGENCY!**

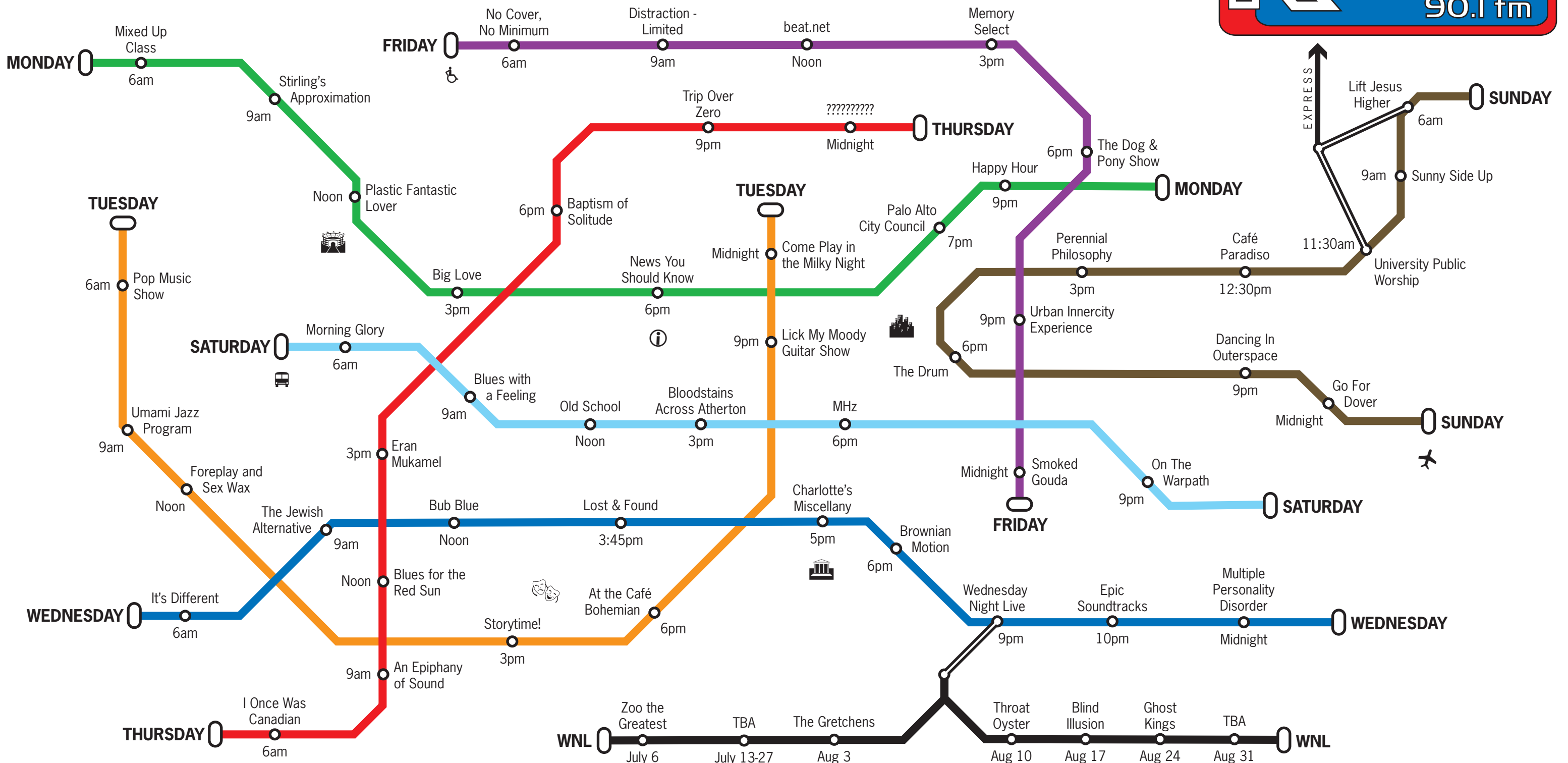
